



Adell Parrish Walpert

March 4, 1919 - February 15, 2016

Adell Parrish Walpert, 96, passed away February 15, at home. She was born March 4, 1919 in Franklin County, the daughter of the late Hubert W. Parrish and Earl Burchfield Parrish. She graduated from Frankfort High School and attended Fugazzi Business School at night while working in her father's trucking business.

She worked fifty-six years in the Truck Lines of Parrish Truck Line, Claxon Truck Line, and W.D. Parker Truck Line.

After retiring for three months, she worked part-time for the Kathryn Shoppe and Carley's Gift Shop; retiring at the age of 90. She was a member and proud Deacon of First Baptist Church since 1937, serving as Sunday School Pre – School Director for thirty-seven years. Member of J.O.Y. Sunday School Class, serving as Secretary, and member of the Senior Group, O.A.S.I.S., since 1985, serving as "Special Events" chairman; member of Altrusa Club of Frankfort. She joined the Peaks mill Christian Church at the age of 10 and was baptized again at First Baptist in 1937.

Including her parents, she was preceded in death by her brothers, Preston, Ernest, Elmo, and Hubert, Jr. Parrish; two sisters, Edna Jewell Parrish and Ruby Morgan.
