C. Walter Duvall, 97, of Frankfort, died Thursday morning at Symphony at Oaklawn in Louisville. A native of Sweden, Kentucky, he served as a member of the United States Army Air Corps during World War II and retired as a Purchasing Agent for Hunter Engineering Company in Riverside, California. Walter earned a bachelor's degree in theological history and was a member of First Church of God in Frankfort.
