



## Eugene Radford Smothermon

April 23, 1919 - July 6, 2010

Eugene Radford Smothermon, 91, of Frankfort passed away Tuesday, July 6, at Frankfort Regional Medical Center.

Mr. Smothermon was born near Hazel in Calloway County, KY to John and Minnie Smothermon and was preceded in death by 7 brothers, 4 sisters, and an infant son, David.

He served three years in World War II including two years in the South Pacific as a U.S. Army Staff Sergeant. He then returned home and married Joette Suiter on June 7, 1947 in Union City, TN.

He taught one year in New Athens, IL, then moved to Madisonville, KY where he was Director of the Madisonville Vocational School for 9 years. Finally, he worked for 32 years in the Dept. of Education, Bureau of Vocational Education in Frankfort.

He was a member of the First United Methodist Church, John Browning Sunday School Class, Methodist Men, Retired Teachers Association of Franklin County and the VFW Post 4075. He enjoyed spending time with his family along with fishing and gardening.

He is survived by his wife of 63 years, Joette; one son, Richard (Sally); 3 daughters, Pam (Al) Wink, Lori (Don Jr.) Hamm all of Frankfort, and Sharon (Randall) Stevens, Mt.
