Dr. James Richard "Doc" Hasler, Sr., Frankfort, KY, passed away July 16, 2013.

He was born April 1, 1931, in Salt Lake City, UT. He fought in the Korean War as a sergeant in the Marines. He married Rosemary Snow in St. George, UT on May 30, 1952. Doc had a BS from Utah State and a doctorate in veterinary medicine from Kansas State.

Doc worked as a veterinarian and a Meat Inspector for the U.S.D.A. He was a gifted artist and master wood carver. He had a life-long passion for the Boy Scouts of America. He achieved the rank of Eagle Scout and was awarded the Silver Beaver for his dedication and service to scouting.

James is preceded in death by his parents; twin brother, Rodney Hasler and dear wife Rosemary. He is survived by eight children, 24 grandchildren and 18 great-grandchildren.
