



John Lawrence Hunt

September 2, 1921 - January 7, 2016

John Lawrence Hunt passed away peacefully at his home in Frankfort on Thursday, January 7th. There are no immediate arrangements, but his ashes will be placed with his wife's in the gardens at the Louisville Presbyterian Seminary at a time to be announced.

John was born in Memphis, Tennessee to Frances Mae and John Lee Hunt on September 2, 1921. He grew up in Memphis, served in the U.S. Marine Corps during WWII and was wounded in action in the South Pacific. After the war he attended the University of Alabama where he met his wife Geneva. He became a newspaper editor in Alabama, then later attended and graduated from the Louisville Presbyterian Seminary and was subsequently ordained. After pastoring churches in Indiana and Ohio he became the minister at South Frankfort Presbyterian Church here in Frankfort where he worked until he retired. He was most noted for his work with the youth in the church, leading them on trips with Native American tribes in various states and Canada. John's beloved wife of many years, Geneva Ming Hunt, predeceased him. He is survived by his daughter Jennifer McCormick and her husband Dr. John McCormick, and granddaughter Anna; his son Rex Hunt and his wife Heather Housman and granddaughters Cathryn and Sarah.
