Mary Joyce Barth Stanfield, 79, beloved mother of Sharon Joyce Stanfield Mitchell (George) and David Edward Stanfield, passed into eternal rest April 23, 2010, at 2:50 a.m. after a long battle with Renal Cell Carcinoma. Ms. Stanfield was preceded in death by her son, Frank Edward Stanfield, III, and a brother, William L. Barth and a grandson, John Mitchell.

Joyce was born April 29, 1930, in Louisville, Kentucky, to the late Carl Frederick and Margaret Lillian Yent Barth. She was retired from Kentucky State Government, Kentucky Labor Cabinet in 1998. She also worked for I.A.P.E.S. for 22 years prior. She was a graduate of Valley High School, Louisville, where she was a member of the Women's Basketball Team and School Choir.

Joyce was a member of Westview Baptist Church, Frankfort, KY, where she faithfully served her Lord Jesus Christ. She was a 61 year member of Order of the Eastern Star, Hiram Lodge #93, Frankfort, where she had served as Worthy Matron and was Past Deputy Grand Matron of the Grand Chapter of the Order of Eastern Star. She had also been a member of the Order of Rainbow Girls.

Joyce is also survived by two granddaughters, Lisa Carol Mitchell and Reba Fawn Mitchell; a brother, Carl F. Barth, Jr. (Gladys) of Tampa, Florida; and a sister-in-law, Kay Barth, Lehigh, Florida; two cousins, Edna Mae Wellman and Donnie Beckhart (Marlene), both of Louisville, KY; and eleven nieces and

nephews. She is also survived by many devoted friends and her beloved church family.
