Orvin "Bud" Eaton, 84, Bagdad, passed away Sunday evening at Jewish Hospital, Shelbyville. Funeral services will be held Wednesday, September 28, 11:00 a.m. at LeCompte-Johnson-Taylor Funeral Home. Rev. Ray Cummins will officiate. Burial will be in Bagdad Cemetery.
