Mr. Wise died Thursday at FRMC. A native of Frankfort, he was the son of Raymond Douglas and Louise O’Nan Wise. Early in life, he worked at the state Dept. of Libraries, where he met his wife. After retiring from a 31 ½ year career in the KY National Guard, this Master Sergeant went on to retire again from the Dept of Military Affairs, working at both Boone National Guard Center and Bluegrass Station.

In addition to his mother, survivors include his wife of forty-three years, Lee Anne Sorg Wise; two sons, Timothy D. Wise (Melissa) and David Wise, Frankfort; a brother, Ronald C. Wise, Frankfort; a sister, Teresa Ann Brooks (George, Jr.), Versailles; two grandsons, Christopher D. and Taylor Wise. He was preceded in death by his father.

Pallbearers will be his sons, grandsons, brother and brother-in-law.
