Celebration of Life services for Richard Stanley "Stan" Smith, 81, of Frankfort will be held Thursday 6:00 p.m. at First Christian Church, 316 Ann St. Frankfort. He passed away November 5, 2013 at Taylor Manor Nursing Home, Versailles.

Born in Louisville, KY on September 27, 1932 to James David and Opal White Smith, he was a graduate of Manual High School and Transylvania University. He attended Lexington Theological Seminary and completed graduate work in sociology at University of Ky. At Transylvania he was a member of Phi Kappa Tau fraternity, Lampus and served on the Alumni Board.

Stan worked in the health field for 33 years with the Kentucky Dept. of Health, Fayette Co. Health Dept. and Dept. of Human Resources in local health. For 23 years he was an elected member of the board for Commonwealth Credit Union. Stan was a member of First Christian Church and served as a deacon. He was a founding member of Habitat for Humanity serving as president in 1993 till 1995.
