Rosalie passed away on April 29 after an eight year battle with Corticobasal Ganglionic Degeneration. She was born in Barboursville, WV on September 24, 1930, daughter of the late Leonard and Lennie Browning Dunkle.

She lived many years in Tucson, Arizona before moving to Finchville, Ky. While living in Finchville she was active in the community-working for the Red Cross blood drives, as a Sunday School teacher, and in the early 1970's she helped sponsor a Cambodian family and helped to integrate them into life in Kentucky.
