He left us with many memories and stories to tell and reminisce about for many years to come.

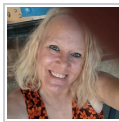

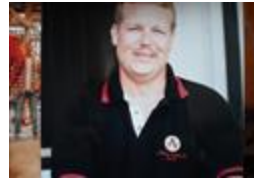


I was thinking the same thing You said, He is gone much too soon. He has worked so hard all his life that He very much deserved His Golden Years and grow old.
